It has been a very busy and productive short week at school. Last weekend, many families enjoyed attending special COVID- safe Easter services at Church. For some families, this was the first time they had attended a service for many months because of the lockdown restrictions.

For those families who have already celebrated Easter, I know that the long Bank holiday was appreciated as a time to relax together and to reflect on the miracle of Jesus' resurrection and His endless love.

All students have settled back into our school routines with ease. There is a wonderful ethos of focus and concentration on learning in classrooms with exemplary behaviour for learning. I thoroughly enjoyed visiting a Year 10 English Literature lesson where the students were learning about Blake's poem 'London.' I saw students reading with passion and demonstrating



excellent skills of high-level analysis and interpretation of the text. 

Thomas Sunday



Once again, a glorious Resurrection, Christos Anesti -Christ is Risen to all of our students and families.

In case you are wondering why we are repeating this phrase after the recent Easter celebrations, it is a greeting all believers share for forty days after the first Sunday of our Lord's Resurrection.

The Sunday which follows Pascha/Easter (the Second Sunday of Pascha) is called "Thomas Sunday", because it recounts the appearance of Jesus to the Apostle Thomas eight days after His resurrection (John 20:19-29).

This day is also called New Sunday but more commonly Thomas Sunday in the Orthodox Church manly because Thomas did not hear of Christ's Resurrection and doubted it. We remember his doubt but do not repeat it. After this Sunday, the Church dedicates Sunday to the Resurrection.

As the Disciples were gathered together on the Sunday following the Resurrection, Jesus entered and greeted them in His usual way, saying, "Peace be unto you." Then He showed them His hands, feet and side, Jesus ate before His Disciples and reassured them of His Resurrection. However, Thomas was not with them at that time, and insisted upon seeing the Saviour's scars— the print of the nails in His hands and feet, and the spear in His side—before he would believe that Jesus was risen. Jesus told Thomas to see and feel. Then Thomas immediately cried out, "My Lord and my God!" But Jesus tells His Disciples, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." This also clearly illustrates the two Natures of Christ: the human and the divine.

Through his doubt in the Resurrection of Christ the Lord, a new proof was given of that monumental event. The Lord said to Thomas: Reach hither thy finger, and behold My hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into My side: and be not faithless, but believing. And Thomas replied: My Lord and my God (John 20:27-28).

After the descent of the Holy Spirit, when the Apostles cast lots to see where they would each go to preach, the lot fell to Thomas to go to India.

St Andrew the Apostle

Thomas converted many in India to the Christian Faith, and established the Church there, appointing priests and bishops.

While the tomb was sealed, Thou didst shine forth from it, O Light. While the doors were closed, Thou didst come in to Thy Disciples, O Christ God, Resurrection of all, renewing in us through them an upright spirit, according to the greatness of Thy

By the intercessions of Thine Apostle Thomas, O Christ our God, have mercy on us.

Amen.
